## What is WICAP?

**WICAP**— is a nonprofit organization made up of several different programs that focus on assisting low-income individuals become self-sufficient by providing services to enable them to improve their financial, physical, mental and social level.

**Our Mission** - Compassionate people serving communities through individualized programs to provide opportunities that create a thriving culture.



## What is LIHEAP?

**LIHEAP**- A federal program that helps low income households with the heating of their home.

- Eligible households may receive assistance with a one-time payment for heating costs during the Winter season.
- Emergency assistance may also be available if there is a “disconnect” notice in place.

### Emergency programs:

- Crisis -customers who are either without utility service or have received a 10-day shut-off notice.
- Keep the Kids Warm Fund- assists with heating costs for low-income families with children.



## TEFAP—The Emergency Food Assistance Program

**TEFAP**— A federal program that helps supplement the diets of low-income Americans, including elderly people, by providing them with emergency food and nutrition assistance at no cost. Eligible households can receive USDA commodities once a month at our local office. We have partnered with local Food Banks to help contribute to our community.
